**Lodging at Camp Calumet:** There are several options for lodging. Full linen service will be provided in all areas of the camp for our convention. Parking is available at all lodging areas. Cars can be moved closer to the Conference Center if you wish.

The Conference Center is the main building where most activities related to the Convention are held. There are a limited number of beds on the first floor and these will be reserved for women who are unable to manage stairs. They will be assigned on a first-come, first serve basis. All rooms in the Conference Center have a private bath.

The Village Cabins are located within walking distance of the Conference Center. Most Village Cabins have a common area for visiting.

The Staff House is lakeside. Beds are bunk-style but typically upper bunks are not utilized. There is a kitchen and common room downstairs in the Staff House.



Upon arrival at Camp Calumet, please register in the Conference Center to get your room assignment.

Registration begins at 3pm on Thursday, October 24<sup>th</sup>. Snacks\*, beverages, and fellowship will be available in the Conference Center beginning at 3pm.

\*Located in the Conference Center is a Refreshment Center with coffee, tea, water, and fresh fruit available to registrants twenty-four hours a day. Should you wish for other snacks, you are invited to bring them to share. Also, in the Conference Center are lounges and common areas that have television, books, and games for your enjoyment.\*

Wear comfortable walking shoes if you wish to walk the lovely grounds of Calumet. Bring a jacket since the weather is unpredictable in late October. Dress for the convention itself is casual. Dressing in layers is recommended.

We are pleased to announce that the **Reverend Abby Johnson** (St. James, Southbury, CT) and the **Reverend Niki Harvell** (Faith, Quincy, MA) will be with us throughout the weekend. They will offer prayer, Bible Study, worship, and will be available to talk privately for those women wishing to do so. Our new **Bishop-Elect Reverend Nathan Piph** will attend. We are happy to report that the Churchwide Women of the ELCA president, **Myrna Wells-Ulland** (from Phoenix, AZ) will be our honored guest. **Diane Peterson** (piano) and **Dot Kasik** (song leader) round out our musical guests.

During the weekend there will be a Silent Auction for all women to enjoy. Each Congregational Unit is invited to send a gift or two for the Auction, which will benefit our **Triennial Convention Scholarship Fund**.
